## 1 President's Report

Congratulations to all the players, supporters and volunteers as season 2009 will go down as the year the Club won 3 awards from the AFL NSW/ACT Greater Sydney Junior region as well as a premiership for the U16 Division 1 team. The awards won by St Ives were:

- The Best Team on the North Shore for our U13s Div 3 side
- The Best Club on the North Shore
- The Best Junior Code Promotion in the Sydney Harbour Competition.

### **The Best Team on the North Shore for our U13s Div 3 side**

St Ives U13 Div 3 came out as the North Shore best team across 3 age groups, 8 divisions of competition, and 26 teams. The umpires voted on this award across the 16 rounds of the home and away season based upon the following attributes:

- Player behaviour to umpires
- Player behaviour to opposition
- Coaches behaviour
- Runners/water carriers behaviour
- Parent's acceptance

St Ives U13 Div 3 scored top marks in every attribute to take this award.

### **The Best Club on the North Shore**

As a Club, St Ives also rated above average overall to be awarded the Best Club on the North Shore, which demonstrated that the Club's approach to the game across all youth grades is consistent and of a very high standard.

The last Club to take out both the Best Team and the Best Club award in the same year was St Ives 32 years ago back in 1977.

### **The Best Junior Code Promotion Award**

In winning the Best Junior Code Promotion for 2009, the Club embarked on a number of community based initiatives for the season. This raised the profile of the Club and the game of Australian Football to see the Club honoured for its promotion of a good club ethic.

### **Overall Highlights**

In Auskick we generally get a drop off in numbers towards the end of the season, but this year through the enthusiasm and energy of Ged and the Auskick coaching crew it was very pleasing to see that we were able to maintain consistent numbers throughout the year. With that, I must thank the following people for making it possible. Firstly, the coaches, Ged, Lynton, Trent, David and Jordan. Next, there is Natalie as registrar. A special thanks to Jordan for providing the AMF Bowl Family Passes to help boost our canteen.

The youthful exuberance of the juniors allowed St Ives to field 8 teams across the 4 age groups (U09s to U12s). The evening up of the teams in U09s to U11s enabled the younger age groups to compete fairly and as a squad. The grading in the U12s saw both teams play in the finals. The U12s Div 1 was unlucky not to make it to the grand final after dominating for most of the season.

Thank you to Josh Graeve, (St Ives umpire), and Hugh Jarman (Duke of Edinburgh Award - U15/16s) for their support at the U09s training throughout the season.

Thank you to all across the age groups: the coaches, assistant coaches, ground managers, team managers, and alike for their support during the season.



Other highlights include: a Swans Visit with a replica of the AFL Premiership Cup, a road trip to the bush to play footy, an ANZAC Tribute Round, a visit by Tim Bailey from Channel Ten for the weather, and wearing pink socks on Mother's Day to raise over \$2,300 for the McGrath Foundation.

The U15/16s Div 1 won the premiership, the first U16 premiership for St Ives in 24 years since 1985. This capped off a bumper year where the Club fielded 13 teams across the age group competitions from U09s to U16s:

- Excellent code of conduct by all players and parents across the Club.
- Overall player numbers steady at 320 despite the economic woes.
- A solid financial result despite reduced fundraising and canteen takings.

Thank you to our sponsors for supporting the Club financially. Century 21 was once more our major sponsor and we are very appreciative of the support from Craig Marshall – 2009 was Craig's 9th year of sponsoring the club. ## 9 Canteen

The canteen's financial fortunes were somewhat 'off the pace' this year (profit of around \$8,000), in keeping with the economic times. A number of local circumstances also impacted our bottom line:

- Several rounds washed out
- Inclement weather and late switching of some matches to other venues has seen fewer families milling around the canteen to watch more than their own son's game
- Fewer Auskick players enrolled - a good number of fathers typically enjoy a hearty BBQ breakfast
- Insufficient matches scheduled at Acron for some rounds also led to canteen closures
- No Auskick Gala Days at Acron

Bucking the economic woes, Andrea Lawrence's enthusiasm for a new and expanded lolly range saw profits increase in this segment. However, coffee sales were down - we are hoping the scheduled 2010 draw and sunnier weather will bring the crowds back next year. We are very fortunate to have a profitable canteen, staffed by volunteers, that did relatively well in a tough year, and our profits should bounce back when the economy improves.

The Auskick Canteen Coordinators, (Raelene Ravenhall, Virginia Symonds, Rod Jackson and Linda Buchanan), were very ably led by Auskick Team Manager, Natalie Brumby, to ensure the canteen was set up ready for the day as well as training each Auskick Crew.... A big thank you to all. Further thanks as well to all our dedicated Team Managers for so capably filling the roster with parents throughout the day.

I don't think I ever fully removed my 'trainer wheels' as Canteen Manager... A huge thank you to Andrea Lawrence for everything she has don't up front and behind the scenes for the canteen over so many years now. The position of Canteen Manager (job sharing encouraged) is open for 2010. As departing U16s parents at the end of next year, Andrea and I feel it is best to be on hand to help any new people transition into the role.

## 10 Recruitment

The previously vacant position of Recruitment Officer was filled for the 2008/09 season. Details of the total player contingent are provided under **Registration**.

### Summary

The season began with a traditional direct approach to recruiting new players. However, towards the end of the season, there was an increasing acceptance that club culture and values play a far more significant part in assuring the successful long term recruitment and retention of players. As a consequence, a new strategy has been drafted that will underpin the recruitment campaign for the coming season and beyond.

### Activity

At the season outset, recruitment activity initially focussed on bringing new players into the club using a blend of tried and trusted methods, eg:

- recruitment day at St Ives Shopping Village
- banners
- footy clinics
- notices in schools (flyers, newsletters)
- adverts in North Shore Times (and other publications)
- redirected enquiries from AFL
- website



- newsletter
- school activities (eg Turramurra HS Award, liaison with HS comp, PSSA etc)

New initiatives were trialled including the Footy Ambassador Program and the distribution of 'Play AFL With Your Mates' cards.

#### Observations

Whilst data is inconclusive, there is a strong suggestion that word of mouth has a disproportionate impact on recruitment and seems to have yielded a greater return for the limited direct investment. If so, the Club culture and values would appear to be a major driver of recruitment and retention.

#### Special Events & Opportunities

A series of special events were staged progressively through the season including the Swans visit, Pink Sock round, the Cootamundra Bush Trip, the Anzac Day Round and the Indigenous Round. These served to raise awareness of the Club as a bastion of healthy sporting competition coupled with a commitment community values and family-friendliness. The resultant exposure of the Club was huge. By continuing with the delivery of these special, or any other, events, the Club has the opportunity to build its profile in the catchment. This should enhance recruitment.

## **11 Treasurer's Report**

2009 was the year of the Global Financial Crisis and the Club's finances were weakened but still remained sound, as the Club achieved a Net Result quite near to the 2008 Net Profit. Registration Income almost reached 2008 record levels and fees were kept at 2008 levels.

Canteen income was down nearly 30%, however expenses were also down 30%. Accordingly, net profit from canteen fell by about a third to a little under \$9000.

Fundraising was down nearly 40% with profit from the fundraiser down to about \$4000.

Sponsorship remained solid despite the GFC thanks to our main sponsor, Century 21.

Overall, despite lower turnover in all areas in slower economic times, costs for the year were proportionately lower and the Club remains in a solid financial situation, with the full year result for 2009 adding over \$11,000 to net assets.
